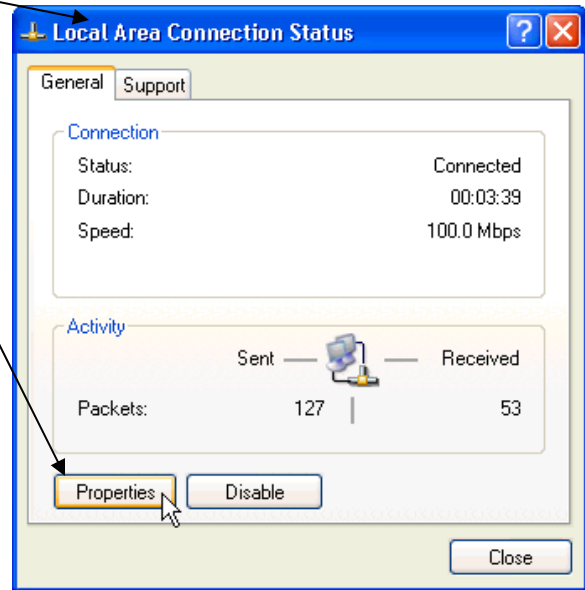


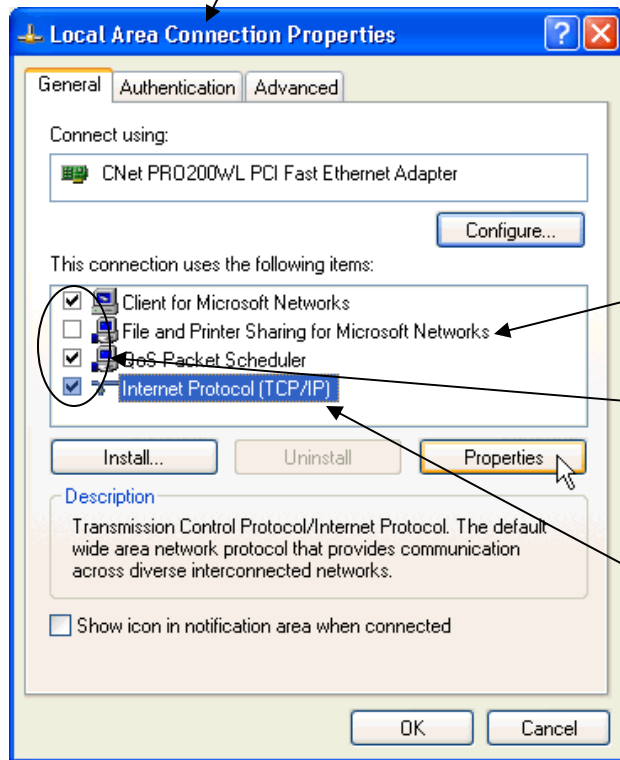
Configuring Windows XP for networking at UVa

1. Click **Start:Control Panel**. Choose **Classic View**, then choose **Network Connections**, then **Local Area Connection**. You get this dialog box.



2. Click the **Properties** button.

3. That makes this dialog box appear.



4. Make sure **File and Printer Sharing for Microsoft Networks** is unchecked. Checking it shares your hard drive and printer with others.

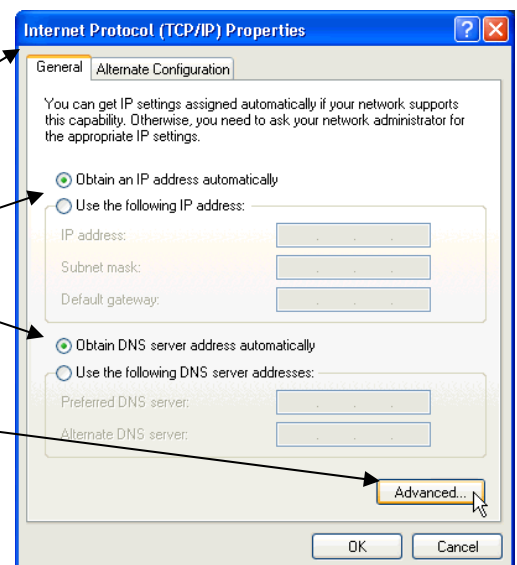
5. Make sure **Client for Microsoft Networks**, **QoS Packet Scheduler**, and **Internet Protocol (TCP/IP)** are all checked.

6. Double click **Internet Protocol (TCP/IP)**.

7. This dialog box appears.

8. Select **Obtain an IP address automatically** and **Obtain DNS server address automatically**.

9. Click on the **Advanced** button.



10. Turn this page over and follow the directions you find there.

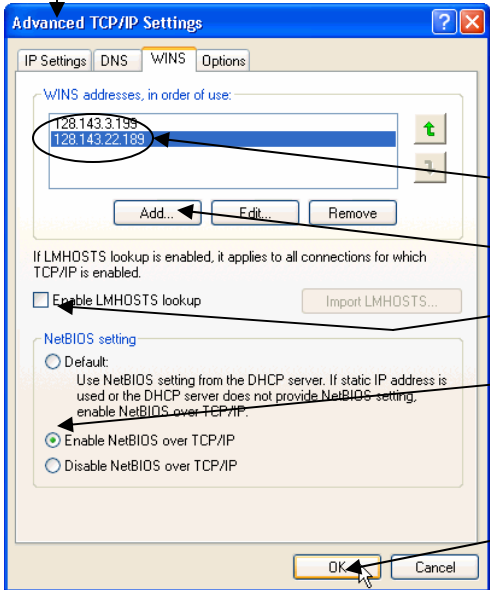
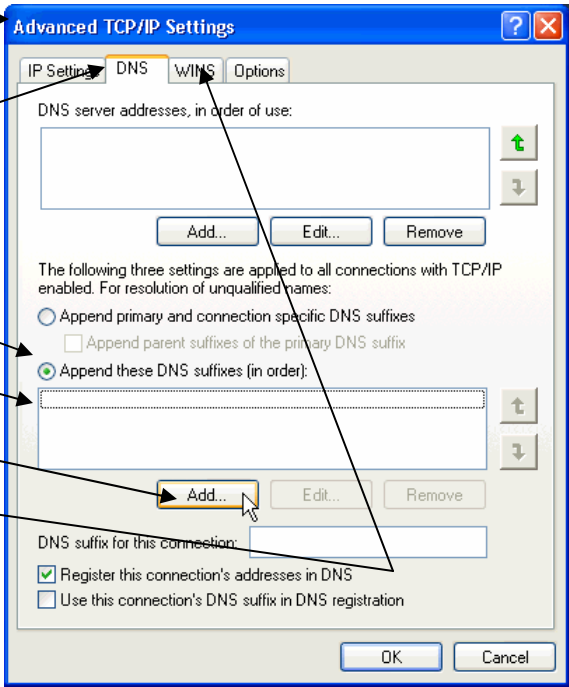
11. That brings up this dialog box.

12. Click on the **DNS** tab. Remove entries in the top box.

13. Select **Append these DNS suffixes (in order)**.
14. If **virginia.edu** does not appear here then click the **Add** button to add it.

15. Now, click on the **WINS** tab.

16. This dialog box appears.



17. Make sure **128.143.3.199** and **128.143.22.189** appear here, or click the **Add** button and add them.

18. Clear (no check mark) **Enable LMHOSTS lookup**.

19. Select **Enable NetBIOS over TCP/IP**.

20. Click the **OK** button.

21. This will give most people access to the Internet at the UVa Network for Web browsing and Email. If it works, continue to the web site <http://www.itc.virginia.edu/desktop/quickstart/winxp.html> for UVa recommended software installation and configuration links.

22. If you have difficulties, you might want to return to the dialog box described at the top of this page and click on the **Support** tab at the top of the dialog box. That will tell you your IP address and other information that might prove helpful to the Help Desk when you call them at 4-3731.
